Does it benefit people when they try new things?

Why do some people eat the same things all the time?

3. Describe a holiday you want to go on in the future

You should say:

Describe a bicycle/motorbike/car trip that is interesting (refer to “transport” in part 1 as well for part 3 questions)

You should say:

How you would like to go there;

And explain why you would like to go there by car, motorbike or bike.

- How important is childhood?

Other possible questions:

Who did you spend most time with when you were young?
Why do some young people dislike living with old people?
What do you usually do when you hang out with your friends?
Do you like to spend time on your own or with your family/friends?

You should say:

Are there any other historical events that you find interesting?
Do you think the internet is a good place to learn about history?
Can you name a person from history who you would like to learn more about? Why would you like to learn more about him/her?
Do you think people should be able to see historical exhibitions for free? Do you think museums should be free?
Should private companies build museums?
Do people in Vietnam like visiting museums and art galleries?
Do you think going to museums and art galleries is beneficial for children? / Do schools in Vietnam have field trips to museums?

What would you do if you bought something disappointing from the Internet?

What kinds of goals are not realistic?
Why do people set goals?
What would you feel if you couldn't achieve your goals?
Do you think people should have plans or just do whatever they like immediately?

Are there any differences between the things can be easily got and those you saved money for a long time to get?
What do people do when they are waiting?
Are you a patient person? (30 years old)
What are the differences between waiting for your families or friends and waiting for the seats at a restaurant?

What are the differences between living in the countryside and living in a city?
Do young people in your country like to live with their parents or by themselves?
Do Vietnamese people like to rent a place to live?

You should say:

How you told him/her
And explain why you disagree the decision.

Follow-up questions:

What skills are necessary when making decisions?
How can people improve their decision-making skills?
How do you think computers will change the way people make decisions?
Do parents in Vietnam allow their children to make important decisions about the future?
Do you think that parents should make important decisions for their children?
Do you think that teachers should help students make decisions?

How can older people (parents) help young people (their children) make their own decisions wisely?

What do you think are the qualities of a good leader (or, a good decision maker)?

Do you think it's important for parents to encourage the development of leadership abilities in their children? (Why? / Why not?)

In what ways can parents encourage their children to develop leadership abilities?

What should children pay attention to when they are learning swimming?
Which one is safer, swimming pools or the sea near the beach?

Does it give people more status to eat in a restaurant rather than eat at home?

Do people now go to restaurants more than before? (Why?/Why not?)

What's the difference between eating at home and eating in a restaurant?

Is there any difference between home-cooked food and food in restaurants?

Which food do you think is healthier, restaurant food or home-cooked food?

17. Describe a kind of foreign food you tried. / would like to have (đổi thì)

You should say:

What it was;

When and where you had it;

Why you had it;

And explain how you felt about it.

Follow-up questions:

What is the most popular foreign food in Vietnam?

Will you try new dish?

What do old people like to eat?

Why do some many families eat the same foods every day?

Why do some people taste change?

Which are more popular in your country: fast food restaurants or traditional restaurants?

Some people say that food in an expensive restaurant is always better than food in a cheap restaurant – would you agree?

Do you think there will be a greater choice of food available in shops in the future, or will there be less choice?

How important is it for a country to be able to grow all the food it needs, without importing any from other countries?

What are the differences between big companies and small companies/shops?

What would you do if you receive a bad service?

Other possible questions:

What jobs require staff to get in touch with many people?
What qualities do the staff need? Why?
What's the different between services in big shops and small shops?
How should people do when they get bad service?
Why do some people not know what service is good?

19. Describe an interesting talk or speech you heard recently

You should say
When and where you heard it
What the talk or speech was about
Who gave the talk or speech
And explain why you think it was interesting

Follow-up questions:

Who will be invited to lecture?
When you give your speech, you encounter any problems? Do you think some adults feel tension when they are giving a speech?

Other possible questions:

What kinds of people will be invited to give a speech?
What kinds of speeches are interesting?
Is listening to speeches important to children?
How to select simple speeches for children?
Will Vietnamese people feel nervous when it comes to public speaking?

20. Describe a kind of weather that you like.

You should say:
What it is
What you usually do in this kind of weather
How you felt about it
And explain what influences it may bring to you

Follow-up questions:

What's the difference between 'season' and 'weather'?
Please briefly describe the different seasons in Vietnam.
In general, do you think people prefer to live in very hot places or very cold places?
In the future, what do you think will be some of the effects of global warming?
For Vietnamese people, how important is protecting the environment?
Where can people get weather reports? How do weather reports affect people's life?
What do people do on rainy days and sunny days?
Has climate change affected your country?

Does weather affect your mood?
What kinds of pollution are serious in your country?
What can individuals do to protect our environment?
Do you think individuals should be responsible for pollutions?
Why is there a need to involve government in environmental protection?

Other possible questions:

What kinds of clothes do people wear in summer?
What the least favorite season for you?
What types of weather are suitable for outdoor activities?
If the weather is bad, what would people do indoors?
What's the most typical weather in your country?

21. Describe a polite person you met.

You should say:
Who this person was;
When and where you met this person;
How you met;
And explain why you think he or she was polite.

Follow-up questions:

How do people politely in Vietnam?
Should teachers teach children how to keep manners?
How can teachers teach the children to be polite?
What is the difference between urban and rural people in their way of behaving politely?
People in the past and today: who is more polite?

22. Describe a time you were not allowed to use your mobile phone.

You should say:
When and where it was;
Why you were not allowed to use your phone; what you wanted to use your phone for;
And explain how you felt about not being able to use your phone.

Follow-up questions:

When do you need mobile phone most?
What are the differences between young and old people who use mobile phones? Do young people and old people use cell phones in the same way?
Do you have a mobile phone (= "a cell phone")? What do you use it for? Is your cell phone important for you in your daily life?
When do you use it? How often do you use it?
When did you get your first mobile phone?
What feature (or, function) of your cell phone do you like the best?

Is there anything you dislike about using cell phones?
What's the difference between sending a text message and calling someone?
Do you think you will continue using your mobile phone in the future?
Do you prefer face-to-face conversations or conversations by phone?
Would you say that cell phones are important in today's society?
Do you think cell phones ever cause problems for people?
Do you think people should turn their cell phones off (or turn them to "silent ringing") when they are in a cinema or similar places?

And explain how the two people get along with each other.

Follow-up question:

How do you think about the normal Vietnamese family life?

Do you live in a nuclear family or an extended family?

Which do you prefer to live in, a nuclear family or an extended family?

What are the advantages and disadvantages of living in an extended family?

What is the generation gap between the old and the young?

Do you feel that the characteristics of parents are always passed on to their children?

Are young people more influenced by their friends or their family?

Why is it important for children to live with adults? (What effects do adults have on children?)

How has family life changed in Vietnam in the recent past?

What are the responsibilities of parents?

What are the benefits (and possible disadvantages) of living in extended families?

Do young Vietnamese like to watch foreign films? Hollywood movies and Vietnamese movies, which are more popular?
How would you define a good movie?
Is it important to have famous actors in a movie if the movie wants to be successful?
Do you prefer to watch a movie at home or in a cinema?
What characters do adults like in movies?
What is the difference between the films that children like and adults like?
What is the difference between the films that men like and women like?

Why are martial arts movies so popular?
